



Myrio bows IPTV developer kit

Myrio Corp., maker of set-top box software that has grown popular with the telcos in recent years, has launched an Interactive Development Kit (iDK) for broadband operators that are deploying IP-based video services.

So far, set-top vendors such as Siemens, Amino Communications, Entone Technologies, i3 micro technology and Zhone Technologies have stepped up to support iDK, Myrio said.

The kit includes the tools and elements necessary for broadband operators to deploy set-top box-based applications ranging from digital TV, pay-per-view, video-on-demand, digital video recording and Internet access, noted Myrio CEO Chris Coles.

"As broadband operators become true full-service providers -- offering voice, video and data -- they have a need to maintain a consistent user experience across a disparate set of hardware and software platforms," he said, in a release.
